Public Transit – Human Services Transportation Providers Greene, Miami, Montgomery and Northern Warren Counties

This guide is a snapshot of human service and public transit agencies which are providing transportation to some segment of the public in Greene, Miami, Montgomery and northern Warren Counties as of May, 2008. The providers listed will take ride requests from the public or referrals from other agencies if potential riders live in their service area and meet the agency's other criteria. The public transit agencies are open to the general public in their respective service areas. All the providers have capacity restraints. The individual listings detail service areas, hours, fares (if any) and any other specific policies of the agency.

This is not a comprehensive list of every organization which provides transportation. Agencies which only provide transportation to their own clients as part of a larger service are not included in this list. Private, for-profit transportation providers are also not on this list, but can be found in the telephone directory, usually under **Taxicab, Transportation, or Ambulance Services**.

Some of the agencies listed only provide transportation in a certain geographic area and are open only to specific segments of the community (for example, senior citizens living in Kettering). It should also be noted that there are significant parts of the Miami Valley where there currently are no public or non-profit transportation providers.

This information was originally compiled by a consulting firm as part of the Human Services Transportation Coordination Plan in 2007 and 2008 and is maintained by the staff of MVRPC.

In addition to the providers listed, MVRPC also sponsors **RIDESHARE**, a computerized carpool matching service. This program matches riders and drivers looking for work/school commuting options. This service may be appropriate for individuals who do not qualify for other programs, but who are looking for alternatives to driving alone.
