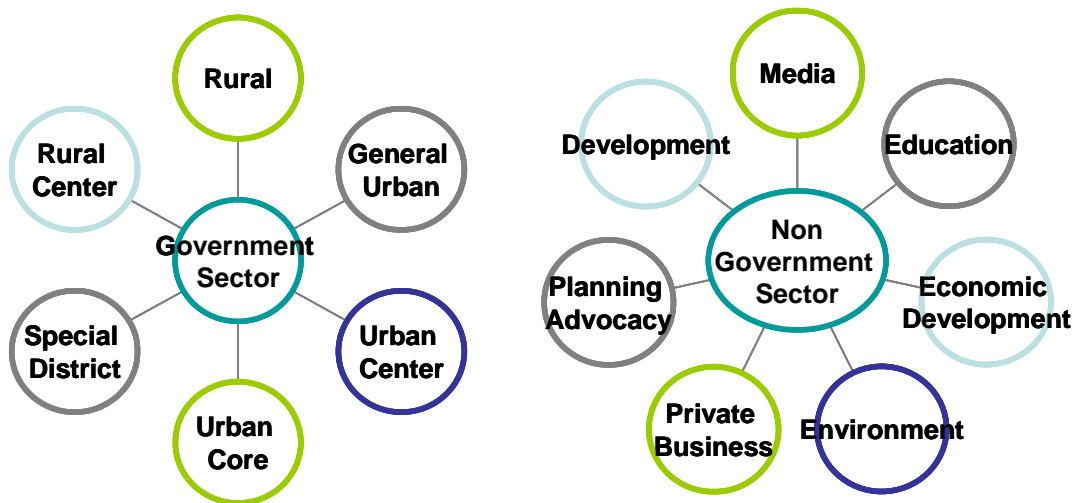


## Going Places Committee Structure

In order for *Going Places: An Integrated Land Use Vision for the Miami Valley Region* to be successful, it is necessary to have the involvement of a variety of Regional stakeholders. To this end, MVRPC is forming two committees: a Steering Committee and a Planning Advisory Committee. The Steering Committee will be responsible for providing leadership and overall strategic direction for the initiative, while the Planning Advisory Committee will be more focused on the technical review of the studies and other materials produced as part of this initiative.

Both committees are to be made up of 20 to 30 members, 40% of which will come from either the MVRPC Board of Directors, for the Steering Committee, or the MVRPC Technical Advisory Committee, for the Planning Advisory Committee. The overall composition of the two committees, however, is premised on having both groups be representative of local stakeholders, both government and non-government. In order to achieve this, the government and non-government sectors have been divided into different categories, from which representatives will be selected. For the government sector, the categories represent different levels of physical development; for the non-government sector, the categories represent various general interest groups.



For Phase I of *Going Places*, which began in July of 2007 and will continue through December of 2008, two to three meetings for each committee are planned. For the purpose of presenting progress and final reports, the two committees may have combined meetings

For Phases II and III, beginning in January of 2009 and concluding in June of 2011, each committee will have formal meetings two to three times per year.

Full participation from committee members is essential for the success of this initiative. MVRPC is counting on these groups to not only provide valuable leadership and input for *Going Places*, but also to be champions of the initiative within the Region, encouraging others to learn more about the project and become involved.
